The staff of Casa Hogar Santa Julia Don Bosco is constantly being strengthened by taking courses and workshops offered by governmental and private agencies.

OPERATIVE

1.- We reinforced in the girls and adolescents the learning of good habits and values, especially "respect for one another".

2.- We were able to achieve constancy in their education (preschool, elementary, middle school, high school and college).

3.- We have achieved an optimized comprehensive development (nutrition, education, physical activation, among others).

The year 2021 began by providing care to <u>21</u> girls and teenagers

Admissions

- <u>0</u> (1st Quarter)
- <u>10</u> (2nd Quarter)
- <u>19</u> (3rd Quarter)
- <u>8</u> (4th Quarter)

Releases

- <u>15</u> girls were reintegrated with their birth family
- <u>0</u> girls were adopted
- <u>8</u> were referred to other institutions

The following services were provided:

- Total of <u>78</u> medical services (Treatments)
- Total of <u>72</u> dental services (Treatments)
- Total of <u>43</u> ophthalmological services (Treatments)
- Total of 653 psychological services (Treatments)
- Total of <u>348</u> nutritional services (Treatments)

Total number of girls and adolescents in residential care* <u>58</u> during 2021 (No. of girls starting 2021 + No. of Admissions).

Ended 2021 with 35 girls and adolescents in residential care.

*Residential care: It is "exercised in any non-family collective environment, such as safe places for emergency care, transit centers in emergency cases and all other short and long term residential care centers, including functional homes"... (Diccionario básico para la perspectiva de los derechos de los Niños, Niñas y Adolescentes en el Estado de Guanajuato).

TEMPORARY HOUSING PROJECT FOR SIBLINGS

At Casa Hogar Santa Julia don Bosco, A.C., we have dedicated ourselves to house girls and teenagers since 1959, and throughout this time we have witnessed a number of psychological situations in which our girls and teenagers find it very difficult to live.

One of the most notable and worrying is the separation of siblings, as we have had several cases in which we are the first shelter for girls and teenagers who not only go through this situation, but also have been separated from their home, arrive at the shelter and at the same time are separated from their sibling(s).



We at Casa Hogar Santa Julia believed that it was our ethical and human duty to offer temporary housing for the brothers (between 3 and 8 years old) of the girls and teenagers who are safeguarded with us. That is why, in June 2021, we implemented the project **"Temporary housing for male siblings"**.
