## 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

*The year 2025 was characterized by continuity in care and the strengthening of conditions that support the well-being of the girls and adolescents.*

### CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE CARE

Throughout 2025, continuous care was ensured for all girls and adolescents, safeguarding their well-being through services such as nutrition, healthcare, education, and emotional support.



## SAFE AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT

Appropriate conditions of care, protection, and supervision were maintained, providing the girls with a safe and dignified space for their development.



## SUPPORT IN THEIR DEVELOPMENT

Ongoing follow-up was provided to each girl's educational, emotional, and social development, strengthening their overall growth.



## 2025 RESULTS

### QUALITY

The staff of Casa Hogar Santa Julia Don Bosco participated in training processes aimed at strengthening their competencies for the comprehensive care of girls and adolescents.

During 2025, at least **four training processes** were carried out for caregivers, operational, and administrative staff. These included Civil Protection training (fire extinguisher use, first aid, evacuation, and search and rescue), workshops on emotional containment, communication and teamwork, as well as training in job skills and mental health promotion.

Some of these trainings were conducted on a regular basis (monthly and every two months). These actions strengthened staff skills, improved team coordination, and contributed to enhancing the quality of care provided to the girls and adolescents.

### OPERATIONS

- 1.- Comprehensive care for girls and teenagers was maintained.
- 2.- Continuity in their education across different school levels was promoted.
- 3.- Access to healthcare services and psychological follow-up was ensured.
- 4.- Habits of respect and positive interaction within the home were strengthened.

## 2025 began by providing care to 14 girls and teenagers

### Admissions

- 2 (Q1)
- 5 (Q2)
- 3 (Q3)
- 3 (Q4)

### Discharges

- 3 girls were reintegrated with their families
- 0 adoptions
- 10 girls were referred to other institutions
- 1 pre-adoptive placement
- 1 teenager completed her stay upon reaching adulthood

### Services provided:

- 30 medical consultations
- 34 deworming treatments
- 46 dental consultations
- 17 ophthalmological consultations
- 324 psychological sessions
- 57 nutritional consultations

**A total of 27 girls and teenagers were in Residential Care\* in 2025 (No. of girls starting 2025 + No. of Admissions).**

**2025 ended with 12 girls and teenagers in residential care.**

**\*Residential Care:** It is "exercised in any non-family collective environment, such as safe places for emergency care, transit centers in emergency cases and all other short and long term residential care centers, including functional homes"... (Basic Dictionary for the Perspective of the Rights of Children and Adolescents in the State of Guanajuato)."

## ACTIVITIES

Throughout the year, recreational and educational activities were regularly carried out, focused on the well-being and development of the girls.



- 9 sessions of handmade soap and shampoo workshop (2 hours each)
- 49 pickleball classes
- 204 tutoring and homework support sessions
- 31 watercolor art classes (2 hours each)
