At Casa Hogar Santa Julia Don Bosco, our team continuously trains through courses and workshops offered by governmental and private institutions, strengthening their skills and commitment to the well-being of our girls and teenagers.

OPERATIVE

- 1.- The girls and teenagers strengthened their practice of good habits and values, with a special emphasis on mutual respect.
- 2.- Consistent attendance in their classes was encouraged at all educational levels: preschool, elementary, middle school, and high school.
- 3.- Comprehensive development was ensured, covering key aspects such as nutrition, education, and physical activity, among others.

An example of this commitment to preparation and strengthening is the recent **EC0934 certification in the care of children and adolescents in social assistance establishments**, obtained by the caregivers (religious sisters) of our institution.

This certification reflects the constant effort to improve care practices, ensuring a safe and suitable environment for the comprehensive development of our girls and adolescents.



Developing Skills for the Future

At Casa Hogar Santa Julia Don Bosco, we are committed to the comprehensive development of our girls and teenagers, providing them with experiences that enhance their learning and practical skills. Through various activities, we equip them with valuable tools that will benefit both their daily lives and their future.

Throughout 2024, they enhanced their education with padel classes, baking workshops, and other activities designed to strengthen their confidence, discipline, and teamwork. These experiences not only expand their knowledge but also help them discover their talents and interests, preparing them for a future full of opportunities.

Activities Carried Out Throughout 2024:

- 36 Baking Classes (5 hours per class)
- 40 Cooking Classes (4 hours per class)
- 76 Professional Styling Workshop Sessions
- 30 Nail Workshop Sessions
- 66 Padel Classes
- 78 Physical Training Classes
- 48 Nursing Assistant Classes
- 60 Academic Tutoring Classes

2024 began by providing care to 14 girls and teenagers

Admissions

- 2 (1st Quarter)
- 2 (2nd Quarter)
- 0 (3rd Quarter)
- 5 (4th Quarter)

Releases

- 3 girls were reintegrated with their birth family
- 0 adoptions
- 4 were referred to other institutions
- 2 unauthorized departures from the institution

The following services were provided:

- Total of 54 medical treatments, 24 vaccinations, and 28 deworming treatments
- Total of 24 dental treatments
- Total of 12 ophthalmological treatments
- Total of 508 psychological services (Therapy sessions)
- Total of 35 nutritional treatments
- Total of 16 laboratory tests

A total of 23 girls and teenagers were in Residential Care* in 2024 (No. of girls starting 2024 + No. of Admissions).

2024 ended with 14 girls and teenagers in residential care.

***Residential Care:** It is "exercised in any non-family collective environment, such as safe places for emergency care, transit centers in emergency cases and all other short and long term residential care centers, including functional homes"... (Basic Dictionary for the Perspective of the Rights of Children and Adolescents in the State of Guanajuato)."
